PREAMBULE

- This regulation refers to CSIT Championships and Technical Commissions' general regulations adopted at the latest CSIT Congress. It cannot derogate from these regulations.
- CSIT organizes amateur championships and has Fair Play as one of its most important aims. CSIT Championships are strictly open for amateur sportsmen. To participate in CSIT Championships the defined eligibility criteria per sport must be respected
- All activities of the CSIT, including its championships are open to the members of the CSIT Unions, observer members Unions and members of the international Confederations which CSIT has signed cooperation agreements according to CSIT general regulations: COPADET (American Continent) / BAWs (Balkan region) and ALSO (Central Africa); also non CSIT members, partners, governmental bodies, trade unions and companies can participate in the CSIT Championships.
- CSIT Championships are organized under the principal of a Zero Tolerance Policy. Not playing for political, religious or discriminatory reason will lead to an immediately exclusion of the team/athlete.
- CSIT Championships are under the regulations of WADA. It is possible athletes can be invited for doping test. More information can be found in the CSIT anti-doping policy which can be downloaded at the CSIT website: <http://www.csit.tv/en/news-service/download-area>
- CSIT Sporting activities (championships, training, tournaments, rallies, etc.) are organized under the responsibility of Technical Commissions by sport. If there is a problem not provided in the regulations, the TC will apply the FIBA Regulations, <http://www.fiba.basketball>

1. BASKETBALL 3X3 Championships

1-1 PERIODICITY / AGE GROUPS

CSIT Basketball 3X3 Championship, **men and women**, take place:

Years in between CSIT World Sports Games

- SENIORS: 19 years and older

During CSIT World Sports Games

- JUNIORS: up to 18 years old
- SENIORS: 19 years till 40 years old
- 40 years and older

1-2 ORGANISATION / REGULATIONS

Championships are held in pools followed by, (depending on the number of teams involved), quarterfinals or direct semi-finals and final.

Each team will play at least 4 games during the championship but no more than 3 games per day.

Championships follow FIBA regulations (see: www.fiba.basketball) (technical instructions and regulations, game rules)

GENERAL RULES

3x3 Basketball is played on 1 hoop by two teams of 3 players and maximum of 1 substitute each.

The game will last 10 minutes or until one of the two teams reaches 21 points. Each offensive possession will last 12 seconds. In case the score is tied at the end of the regular playing time an overtime shall be played. The first team to score 2 points in the overtime wins.

The time will be stopped only during dead ball situation (i.e., it doesn't stop after a basket scored). When a basket is scored the possession changes and the player in possession of the ball shall go outside the three-point line with both feet.

If the defense steals the ball or gets the rebound must clear the ball by going outside of the three-point line as above.

All baskets scored within the three-point line and free-throws count 1 point. All baskets scored releasing the ball from outside the free throw line count 2 points.

Both teams are given 1 time out and it shall last 30 seconds. A timeout can only be called during dead ball situations or after the referee whistles.



Both teams can perform substitutions during dead times or when the clock is stopped without need to notice the officials. The substitution can only take place behind the end line.

There are no personal fouls but only team fouls. After the 6th team foul, each foul shall be penalized with 2 free-throws. After the 10th team foul, each foul shall be penalized with 2 free-throws and the possession.

Championships cannot last more than five (5) days (days of arrival and departure not included).

2. PARTICIATION CONDITIONS

2-1 PARTICIPATING UNIONS

Members of CSIT unions, observer members and members of international confederations which having signed a cooperation agreement with CSIT, can participate. The organizing Union can invite non-affiliated CSIT federations and company sports teams to participate in CSIT Championships or the CSIT World Sports Games.

More than one team per Union can participate.

2-2 MAXIMUM PARTICIPANTS

Each team shall not have more than 6 members:

- 4 players
- 1 coach
- 1 team manager / head of the official union delegation

When a union sends a male team and a female team, the delegation consists of 12 members:

- 4 female players
- 4 male players
- 2 coaches (1 for each team)
- 2 team managers (one for each team)
- 1 head of the official union delegation (one of the team managers)

2-3 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A player can participate in CSIT Basketball 3X3 games when he/she is not registered as a professional player in his/her country or in an other country.

A player cannot participate in CSIT Basketball 3X3 games if he/she plays in the national team of his/her country.

A player cannot participate in CSIT Basketball 3 X 3 games if he/she plays in the first two leagues of his/her country, even if he/she is not registered as a professional player.



3. FAIR PLAY

CSIT championships are organized according the principals of Fair Play. During CSIT Championships athletes, persons and teams can be awarded for acts of Fair Play. Fair Play regulations can be found in the CSIT Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations edition 2021 and later, Chapter 6.

4. REGISTRATION/FUNDING

4-1 REGISTRATION DELAY

- Provisional registration: at least four (4) months before the championship starts.
- Final registration: at least two (2) months before the championship starts.
- Final registration must include the list of all delegation members (first name - last name - birth date - gender - function)

4-2 COVERING CHARGES

- Unions pay for all travelling cost to the city where the championship is organized (round way).
- The organizer Union shall take charge of the following issues:
 - Transportation of delegations from the airport or train station to the hotel on the day of arrival and departure
 - Local transportation during the stay depending on the program (between hotels and sport facilities in particular)
- Full board accommodation (e.g. double room, breakfast, 2 meals a day)Every participant Union shall pay a registration fee as determined at the latestCSIT Congress to the organizing Union for each member of the delegation.
- By the time of issuing of the provisional application forms, the organizer Union can collect an advance payment of 50% of the total amount to be paid by the participating Union, the remaining amount being paid at the time of the permanent registration or on the day of arrival, final deadline.

4-3 CANCELLATION POLICY

- CSIT has a cancellation policy. This cancellation policy covers the payments at preliminary and final registration and the refund payments by cancellation of a participating party or by the host of the championship.
- The article in detail can be found in Chapter 4. under J of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5. ORGANISATION/PREPARATION

5-1 ORGANISING COMMITTEE

The organizing committee by the host is in charge of the preparation and organization of the championship.

The CSIT Technical Commission and a representative of the organizing committee are in charge of the management of the championship during its duration.



See Chapter 4 under F of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5-2 INVITATIONS

The organizing committee sends championships invitations to every CSIT Union (and partners), company sports organizations and guests etc. at least nine (9) months before the start of the championship. Invitations must include this information:

- Participation;
- Sporting activities, social and cultural program;
- Referees needed;
- Boarding facilities;
- Arrival and departure accommodations;
- If possible, general program.

Detailed information can be found in Chapter 4 under D of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5-3 PREPARATION

Depending on the situation and with the CSIT Sports Director's authorization, a member of the Technical Commission (chairman or secretary) can visit the location where the championship is organized, at least three (3) months before it starts, to settle with the organizing Union planning and preparation of the championship. Travelling expense can be covered under certain conditions by the funds awarded to the Football Technical Commission by the CSIT.

5-4 REPORT

Within seven (7) days after the Championships the Organizing Team will send the results to the Secretary of the Technical Commission who will send the results to the Sports Director and office of CSIT.

No later than one (1) month after the end of the championships, the Technical Commission secretary must send a report about the championships and all the sport results plus the minutes of the TC meetings to the members of the Unions, to the Sports Director and to the office of CSIT.

6. REFEREEING

- Each Union must provide one referee per participating team. Unions who do not apply this rule must pay the organizer Union an amount specified in CSIT regulations to cover substitute referees fees.
- The referees are not allowed to assume another position within their own delegation.
- The Technical Commission decides of the refereeing conditions according to the discipline needs based on FIBA regulations.
- Referees must be official referees of their own Union on national or international level. If necessary, a Union can contact referees from its country National Federation or from the FIBA.



7. APPEAL COMMITTEE

- The Appeal Committee is composed of:
 - The CSIT Technical Commission's chairman
 - The CSIT Technical Commission's secretary
 - A person among the participating Unions. Such member shall not participate in the appeals in which his own Union would be involved.
- Appeals for technical reasons must be brought to the attention of the appeal committee as soon as possible after the incident, providing all the necessary information.

Detailed information can be found in Chapter 5 under D of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

8. AWARDS

- The first three (3) teams will be awarded a cup and medals: gold for first place, silver for second place, bronze for third place.

Detailed information can be found in Chapter 5 under F of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

9. TECHNICAL COMMISSION MEETINGS

- The Technical Commission chairman or secretary is in charge of convening a meeting of the commission before and at the end of the championship. A summon containing the date and agenda will be sent to all Unions at least three (3) months ahead of schedule. The chairman, the secretary, Unions representatives, heads of delegation participate. Referees, coaches of participant Unions, members of the organizing committee are invited.
- A preparation and information meeting is organized before the championships under the responsibility of the chairman (and/or Technical Commission secretary and head of the organizing committee from the organizing Union) to inform all delegations of the planning of the championship, to appoint referees to matches, to bring clarifications to regulations if necessary in order to make the event to a success.
- The purpose of the meeting after the championships is to evaluate the championship, to proceed with the modifications of the present regulations if necessary, to prepare future events (planning of next championships) and elections, to take into account the reports on the CSIT congress.
